How to reach

- One can reach Dr. Bhupendra Nath Dutta Smriti Mahavidyalaya, Hatgobindapur both by Road and Railway.
- From Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose International Airport, Kolkata, to college, the distance is 100 km by road. It takes about 2 hours by car via Durgapur Express Highway, NH-2.
- From Kazi Nazrul Islam Airport, Durgapur to College Distance is distance 100 km by road. It takes about 1.30 hours by car via Durgapur Express Highway, NH-2.
- From Bardhaman Railway station, to College Distance 12 KM, it about 20 minutes by car towards Kalna.
- From Bardhaman Bus stand (Alisha and Nabab hat) one can take Govt. Or Private Transport to Hatgobindapur, the distance is about 15 KM. It will take about 30 minutes.


